What will I need to do to gain the Level 2 in Mentoring accredited qualification?

The workshops are participatory, we encourage lots of discussion and activities so that you share your understanding and experiences. We will provide a range of assessment activities for you to complete during the sessions which will be useful for the level 2 accreditation.

You will be supported by a named assessor (Verity or Emma)

The assessment process for the qualification includes a variety of activities that will make up your portfolio, these include:

- Worksheets and short assignments – these will be started as part of the workshop and you can complete them in your own time
- Group discussions with photographs of flip charts – as part of the workshops
- Recorded discussion with your assessor with some questions – we will provide lots of guidance and support
