We are excited to invite new people to join our team of Trustees. Currently, eleven Trustees work together with our Administrator, Jo Cope, to oversee 1Voice. At the AGM, in November, some trustees have decided to step down from their roles with 1Voice. This leaves the way open for others to join us.

Who Can Be a Trustee?

Anyone over 18 can be a Trustee. The key thing is that you have experience and understanding of the lives of AAC users and their families. Our current team is made up of AAC users, parents and siblings of ACC users, professionals from speech and language therapy, education and medical services.

What Do 1Voice Trustees Do?

We work together to make sure AAC users and their families are at the heart of everything we do. We come up with ideas for events, activities and opportunities to support our members.

Our key activities throughout the year are:

- Planning and organising the annual residential weekend
- Running the role model programme
- Organising online events
- Keeping in touch with members via the website, newsletter and facebook page
- Contributing to key external events such as the Communication Matters Conference

What Is Being a Trustee Like? From Alison Douthwaite

As the latest Trustee to join the team, I offered to write this newsletter entry as I remember feeling worried myself not very long ago about what might be involved. I had been to a couple of residential with my daughter and was so happy to find something so tailored to AAC users. When I saw 1Voice needed a trustee, I wanted to help because I felt the charity was so unique and so valuable, but I didn't really know if I would be able to do it, or whether it would be stressful to take on the commitment.

It has actually been fun, rewarding and totally manageable. The group is welcoming, supportive and really open to new ideas and opportunities. The monthly meetings are scheduled at the end of each meeting so you know well in advance, and are well-organised and relaxed. As there is a big team and most of them have been with 1Voice for a long time, there is lots of experience to draw on and lots of support as you settle into being a Trustee.

What Commitment Is It?

- monthly online meeting on a weekday evening (roughly 1 hour)
- get a DBS check (paid for and administrated by 1Voice)
- complete a short online safeguarding training (paid for by 1Voice)
- stay in touch between meetings via our online messaging app



Why Do We Need Trustees?

1Voice is a charity and therefore must have Trustees to operate. Having a large team of trustees, from various backgrounds and situations helps us consider a range of perspectives when we plan activities. We are particularly looking for AAC users or parents of AAC users to join our team.

Bronze, Silver and Gold! My Duke of Edinburgh Journey



Have you been glued to the Olympics and Paralympics coverage? We may not all be elite athletes but we loved hearing about Lana's very own 'bronze, silver and gold' journey at our recent virtual online event.

Lana has been attending 1Voice events for many years and is one of our role models. It was great to have Lana share a film with us showing what activities she chose to do for her Duke of Edinburgh awards (DofE).

The DofE provides an opportunity to discover new interests and talents and is a tool for developing essential skills for life and work. The award is open to people aged 14 to 24. There are four sections to complete at Bronze and Silver level and five at Gold. They involve helping the community/

environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, planning, training for and completing an expedition and, for Gold only, working with a team on a residential activity.

Any young person can do their DofE – regardless of ability, gender, background or location. Achieving an award isn't a competition or about being first. It's all about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries.

Bronze

For her bronze award, Lana worked in the Bikes for Good Causes café, volunteering every Saturday morning for four months. Lana spoke to the customers and took their orders, and made coffees, teas and smoothies for them. She really enjoyed working with the people and meeting the other volunteers and staff.



For the skills section, Lana enjoyed weaving, making a scarf and cushion.

For the physical section, Lana did sailing and learned how to control the ropes and sails. She also enjoyed four nights at Bendrigg Lodge where she took part in a range of outdoor activities.

Lana went on two expeditions for her award, the first acting as a practice trip. Lana received her trophy at a school awards' ceremony.



Silver

Lana volunteered at the Enfield library working every Saturday morning in the children's section putting stickers on books, tidying up and putting books back on the shelves.



For the skills section, Lana loved sewing and made a t-shirt, pyjama trousers and pyjama shorts. This is something Lana has continued to do.

Lana did skiing for the physical section, trying both sit ski and standing ski. Her favourite was the sit ski because she was able to steer. She also went to Andorra on a school ski trip.



Lana took part in a team building away day. Her expedition with friends involved sleeping in a tent for two nights and walking for three days. It was fun but a little tiring.

To collect her award Lana got to go to an award ceremony and meet Prince Edward.

Gold



Lana volunteered in Oxfam on Saturday afternoons. She talked to customers and worked on the till taking payments.

Lana enjoyed cooking for her gold award and had some cooking lessons. She cooked meals like soup and

spaghetti bolognese and sweet things like brownies and crumbles.

For the physical section Lana did horse riding every Saturday morning. She learned how to steer, start and stop her horse and how to trot.

Lana went to Calvert Trust and made new friends whilst trying a lot of outdoor activities. Although Lana has completed her practice expedition, she is still waiting to complete her final expedition which has been delayed because of the Coronavirus pandemic.

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Thank you Lana for sharing your journey with us. We wish Lana all the best in completing her Gold award and hope she gets to go to St James' Palace or Buckingham Palace to receive her trophy soon.

CM2021 International AAC Conference




Mhari
